The April 25, 2016 meeting of the Louis Bennett Public Library was called to order by Bonnie Hersman, with Sharon Snyder, Nancy Colburn, Rose Robinson, Janice Sundstrom and Karen Enderle, Librarian in attendance.

Reading of the Minutes: The minutes of the February 1, 2016 meeting were read and accepted.

Treasurer's Report: The reports of January, February and March 2016 were reviewed and accepted.

Computer Statistics: The reports of January, February and March 2016 were reviewed and accepted.

Old Business

JEM Cleaning and Painting: Karen reported that the HEPA cleaning of the library has been completed. Karen reported the painting of all stairwell areas, entrance areas and repair of the first floor fireplace cost a total of \$3,800. Repointing project will start in the middle of May. Committee Reports

Executive Committee:

No report

Building and Operations:

J. Gum reported that the radio upgrade has been installed. We are now in the process of getting a RFP written to get a new phone system. We have already seen a couple demos, and have scheduled a couple more.

R. Stalnaker has requested that the radios be used in the proper manner (hold button, wait for beeps, then talk. Also tell if the radio frequency is going to be changed).

J. Gum commented that the LCSO has requested that the SIRN system be the primary radio system used. Weston PD, LCSO and DPS are using that radio on day and evening shift. Night shift is still jumping back and forth. There is no alert on that system, just the call announcement.

All Lewis County fire chiefs met at the 911 Center to discuss the failure of the fire levy. The question had been asked regarding services that would be provided vs. what services would be cut back on as far as single company responses. The chiefs have 30 days to return their call list to B. Rowan and the 911 Center.

In the future, run assignments will have to be changed due to the water extension in the southern end of the county. Primarily, additional services

will be needed for Stonewall Resort. J. Spray advised that their tank will be completely out of service for upgrades on a temporary basis.

Budget and Finance:

The fiscal year is winding down. There are currently 2 outstanding invoices. By next Monday all bills will be in and we will finish the year in the black.

Public Relations:

No report

Personnel Committee:

The two trainees have finished with classroom training and are in the radio room with their trainers. They are focusing on CAD work and non-emergency radio traffic.

M. Tatman has completed a schedule with strictly 8 hour shifts and one with 12/8 hour shifts. The schedules will be studied and a final decision will be made in the near future. Each has pros and cons as far as shifts and time off.

The current Personnel Policy states that employees must work 11 days (8 hrs/day) to earn annual leave, however; with our schedule being 12 hr days, that creates an interpretation issue. The County Administrator agrees with the idea that 88 hours a month is the standard. The County Commission agreed, but wants to take the issue to the County Prosecutor for clarification.

EMD/Training Committee:

J. Taylor reported that there were 2 Lewis County and 1 Gilmer County calls that were below the score. The three calls were reviewed. All issues were minor and a couple issues were repeat callers. Nothing major that needed addressed.

M. Tatman advised that the new guidecards have been printed and invoiced. They will be shipped between 6/13 and 6/15/16.

Old Business:

No report

New Business:

R. Stalnaker, TAC Officer, reported that all teletype information must be faxed to the Sheriff's office. Officers have requested for information to be

faxed to the fire/ems offices. This practice is not allowed, per the state office, and the 911 center is not permitted to fax to other locations besides the Sheriff's office (unless the requesting personnel is at another secure location, e.g. CRJ).

B. Rowan commented that the owner of TALA is going to "fence us out" in the near future.

Addressing Report:

As delivered

J. Spray inquired about hydrants and LZs having addresses. S. Money Penny informed that hydrants have addresses and that LZs are an ongoing project. A time frame for completion was requested and J. Gum reported that they will have to work on it. J. Gum will provide EMS/Fire a list of their current LZs for review. J. Spray informed that there have been 22 new hydrants installed that need addressed. It was questioned if Gilmer County hydrant addresses have been updated.

Chairman's Time:

The Gilmer County Folk Festival is scheduled over the weekend. There will be additional coverage for the weekend that is not reflected on the schedule. The officers will let dispatch know when they are on duty.

Hemlock Road will be dedicated on Saturday, 6/18/16.

Director's Report:

B. Rowan questioned if M. Tomey, with Gilmer County Fire, has an email address we could add to the database.

Benefit of the Organization:

B. Rowan expressed thanks to those attending.

J. Spray reported that July 3rd, 9th and September 4th there will be fireworks at Stonewall Resort. L. Gerwig reported that Cedarville will be having fireworks around the holiday in July. Exact time will be determined. Weston's fireworks will be Monday, July 4th.

Gilmer County 4-H Camp will be coming up the end of June at the Gilmer County Rec Center. Lewis County 4-H Camp will be July 3-7.

Motion to adjourn was made by J. Taylor and seconded by J. Gum.

Meeting was adjourned at 15:05. Next meeting will be on July 11, 2016
at 14:00 in Lewis County.



Dear Commissioners:

West Virginia Code 7-4-6 created the West Virginia Prosecuting Attorneys Institute and further provides that each county pays a premium to the State Treasurer for the Institutes use. Since July 1, 1995 the Institute has provided valuable services to the County Prosecutors, their staffs, Law Enforcement and others across West Virginia. Last year the Institute trained 278 prosecutors, over 600 law enforcement in 60 training dates. In addition, the Institute has provided research, technical expertise, manuals, reference guides and other information to the State's prosecutors. Trainee feedback indicates the training and assistance provided by the Institute has been extremely helpful to prosecutors and law enforcement alike.

Another important function of the Institute is providing special prosecutors to the counties when the local prosecutor is disqualified from service in particular cases. This provides not only a cost savings to the counties but also experienced and trained legal representation for the citizens of the various counties'. Over the lifetime of the Institute, the total cost savings to West Virginia Counties is estimated to be \$10,919,700.00. In 2015 the Institute procured nearly 278 special prosecutors.

Enclosed is an invoice for the annual premium which should be prepared and mailed by July 31, 2016 or earlier, for your budgeting convenience. The premium amount was derived by using the rates found in West Virginia Code 7-4-6 and calculated in the manner provided in West Virginia Code 7-7-3(a) upon advice and counsel of the West Virginia State Tax Department.

Your continued support is greatly appreciated, not only the Institute but, by the State's 55 Prosecutors, their assistants and many others in the Criminal Justice system. It has been an honor to provide these services. Thanking you for your continued support, I remain



This funding is provided under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 under regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, including but not limited to 24 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations), Part 570, Sub-Part I, as amended or revised, and subject the State of West Virginia's CDBG-Small Cities Policies and Procedures Manual.

Funds are provided to meet the HUD National Objective of Benefit to Low- and Moderate-Income (LMI) persons to provide the Low Mod Area (LMA) Benefit in the Eligible Activity of Public Facilities to include the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or installation of public improvements or public facilities in accordance with 24 CFR Part 570.201(c).

Based upon the documents submitted by the Region VII Planning and Development Council staff, environmental, administrative, inspection, engineering and related activities associated with this grant have been designated as Exempt by the Lewis County Commission. Due to the ongoing need for this grant funding, failure to fulfill these requirements by the prescribed date may also lead to withdrawal of the CDBG-Small Cities funds.
