IN RE: GENERAL ELECTION CANVASS – RESULTS – NOVEMBER 13, 2012


The Lewis County Commission sat as a Board of Canvass to canvass the votes cast for the General Election on November 13, 2012.

During the canvass one hundred thirty-two (132) Provisional votes were found, and upon motion of Agnes G. Queen, second by Thomas V. Fealy, motion passing, forty-four (44) of the Provisional votes were counted, and eighty-eight (88) provisional votes not being counted.

Upon motion of Agnes G. Queen, second by Thomas V. Fealy, motion passing, that in the event of a recount requested by any candidate, the bond would be set at Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars.

The canvass was completed Tuesday, October 13th, 2012, at 4:15 P.M. o'clock, but results can not be certified until the last county completes their canvass for Congress, State Senate, House and Statewide Offices. Upon notification of the Secretary of State's Office the Commission will meet to certify the results.

ORDERED, that this Commission doth now adjourn upon motion of Agnes G. Queen, second by Thomas V. Fealy, motion passing until Wednesday, November 14, 2012, to convene into Regular Session.
