PRESENT: Honorable Agnes G. Queen, President, Thomas V. Fealy and Patrick D. Boyle, Commissioners.

The foregoing proceedings of this Commission were approved and signed by the President.

IN RE: MINUTES, INVITATIONS, NOTIFICATIONS, CORRESPONDENCE

1. **Upshur County Agenda** – A copy of the Upshur County Commission agenda for January 9, 2014 was filed. No comments.
2. **December 2013 Sheriff's Vehicle Mileage Report** – A copy of the December 2013 ending mileage and maintenance logs for vehicles in the Sheriff's Department Fleet was filed. It was noted that Deputy Posey had high mileage, due to being a K-9 vehicle.
3. **Notification of Lewis Braxton Upshur Community Corrections Board Meeting** – The Lewis Braxton Upshur Community Corrections Board will be meeting January 13, 2014 at 6:00 PM in the Lewis County Commission Meeting Room.
4. **Notification of West Fork Conservation District public Meeting** – The West Fork Conservation District will be holding a public meeting Thursday, January 16, 2014 at 6:00 PM at the Pricetown Fire Department. This meeting is for landowners, sponsors, monitors and Office of Emergency Management personnel to provide updates on easements, operation and maintenance, and emergency action plans.
5. **Notification from the West Virginia Office of the Insurance Commissioner regarding the possible availability of low-cost, federally subsidized flood insurance for government entities and non-profit agencies** – The West Virginia Office of the Insurance Commissioner issued a notification to all West Virginia state and local governmental agencies and non-profit organizations that low-cost, federally-subsidized flood insurance may be available through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). If the agency has property that would qualify for this program and opts not to participate it may jeopardize any future public assistance available for that structure. This information has been forwarded to the Lewis-Gilmer Addressing Office. Commission noted that flood insurance costs could skyrocket.
6. **Lewis Gilmer Emergency 911 Monthly Report for December 2013** – A report of call activities and dispositions processed by the Lewis Gilmer Emergency 911 Center for the month of December 2013 was filed. Calls are categorized by agency, as well as, overall monthly totals. Incoming calls were down but outgoing calls and teletype was up.
7. **Notification that Mahoning Hydropower, LLC has filed a Notice of Intent for Pre-application for a proposed project at Stonewall Jackson Hydropower Plant** – Mahoning Hydropower, LLC has filed a notice of intent for pre-application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission for the proposed Stonewall Jackson Hydropower Project. IN RE: GIS UPDATE

William Rowan, Director Lewis Gilmer Emergency 911 Center reported meeting with Cindy Rowan, Voters Registration Clerk and determining that all corrections have been made. His concern is that Landmark Forestry has not been to voters for several months. The match has not been done. John Snyder, Dog Warden has been using the system for two months. Mr. Snyder informed the commission that the system works if they can get the bugs worked out. Mr. Snyder reported that he can print out the paper work at the pound while still in his truck and then only has to take the animals inside. He has some issues with saving files. Mr. Rowan reported that addressing has a 4 part form of which one copy to the owner, one copy to addressing, one to post office, and one to the assessor's office. Currently the copy to the assessor goes into a drawer, Mr. Rowan requested that copy go to elections and elections will then forward a copy to the assessor.

IN RE: BUDGET WORKSHOP

County Administrator, Cindy Whetsell reported that the West Virginia State Auditor's office will be holding regional workshops on budget preparation and employment tax issues. President Agnes G. Queen and Cindy Whetsell will attend the meeting at Bridgeport on February 4, 2014.

**IN RE: RIDE-ALONG REQUESTS APPROVED FOR
LEWIS COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT**

Krista Jackson of Community Corrections, filed a request for ride along with a deputy sheriff of Lewis County for the purpose of home visits for community corrections clients in order to monitor compliance. The request for Ms. Jackson was approved for a one (1) year period upon motion of Thomas V. Fealy, second by Patrick D. Boyle, vote unanimous. The effective dates of the request starts on 01/13/14 to 01/13/15.

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IN RE: BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Commissioners Patrick Boyle, Thomas Fealy and President Agnes G. Queen reported attending the Region VII meeting and work session with March Westin.

President Agnes G. Queen reported attending the exit interview with the P-Card auditor, Joshua Potter, County Administrator Cindy Whetsell, Deputy County Clerks Debra Hull and Nancy Justice. Although no major items to report were found there were some minor findings. On motion of Patrick D. Boyle second by Thomas V. Fealy, vote unanimous to approve the following changes:

On January 9, 2014, the Lewis County Commission President, Agnes G. Queen, County Administrator Lucinda Whetsell, Deputy County Clerks/Bookkeepers, Debra Hull and Nancy Justice and State P-Card Auditor Joshua Potter met for an exit interview. Mr. Potter audited 3 (three) years of P-Card invoices. The following are the findings.

1. Access to cards – some offices keep all card and some employees have access to other employee's cards.
2. All invoices should have at least two approvals.
3. Insufficient supporting documents, i.e. fuel purchase should have vehicle identification and mileage on receipt.
4. The individual statements should be approved by each individual and they need to check off each item on statement so the auditor knows it has been looked at or compared to a log. A log can also be attached.
5. A few invoices had tax. Out of state tax is permissible.
6. No enough segregation of duties.
7. The auditor recommends meals be excluded from purchase with the P-Card and be reimbursed to the individual.

Because of these findings the following P-Card changes are to be implemented:

1. If you keep all cards in a locked drawer, please have the individuals seal there cards in an envelope and sign the seal.
2. All invoices must have the card holder signature and supervisor signature. If you are the supervisor, county commission approval for second signature is acceptable.
3. If you purchase fuel, you must write mileage and vehicle id on receipt.
4. Individual statements must be check marked by each item and card holder sign and date, not supervisor. If you keep a log, attach a copy of the log to statement.
5. Make sure no tax on hotel bills or other receipts.
6. Nothing can be done.
7. Commission chose not to change this.

Please adopt these changes immediately.


WHEREAS: is it necessary for the Lewis County Commission to authorize the award of said funds for the Ireland Community Corporation and

4. Agnes G. Queen, President, or Lucinda A. Whetsell, Administrator is designated as the authorized official to act in connection with this award.



Michael Herron, Executive Director, EDA reported a very busy week. The EDA board created a by-laws committee. Their suggestions will be presented to the board at the January 22nd meeting. New officers will also be elected at that time.

Mr. Herron reported the state is going to cut their budget 7 1/2% next year.

LURE – Lewis-Upshur-Randolph Effort is creating a micro-statistical report with combined category from the LURE counties. This is an effort to lure big business to the area.

The president of Pierpont Community College announced a training program for the oil and gas industry. Mr. Herron is attempting to find out what is for Lewis County.

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Mr. Herron has been in contact with WV American Water about the Laurel Fork and Alum Bridge Water projects. Projects are 100% funded. Mr. Herron is also checking on how to avoid a water disaster like happened in Kanawha County.

Mr. Herron reported the CNG Refueling Station has opened. It is the third in the state.
