
**WHEREAS**, public safety Telecommunicators are the vital link between the citizen calling for help and the agencies which assist them; and

Whereas, approximately 3 million children are reported abused and neglected in this country each year; and


Whereas, the effects of child abuse are felt by whole communities and need to be addressed by the entire community; and
