Cindy Whetsell, County Administrator attended a Central WV Community Action meeting.




WHEREAS, it is required that the Lewis County Commission appoint an official representative to administer said program And to provide all additional information required by the State government, and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE Lewis County Commission that:


