



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEWIS COUNTY COMMISSION,

WHEREAS, the population of individuals 65 and older will increase by more than a third between 2010 and 2020, going from less than 300,000 to more than 405,000 people; and

WHEREAS, nationally 70 percent of people with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder live at home and need assistance with activities of daily living; and

WHEREAS, almost three-fourths of older people living in the community who received personal assistance relied exclusively on unpaid caregivers for help; and

WHEREAS, 92 percent of West Virginians 45-plus said they preferred to be at home with assistance remaining in their communities.

WHEREAS, providing services and supports to older adults in their homes and communities is generally much less expensive than nursing home care;

WHEREAS, older adults who receive cost effective services in their homes are much less likely to need public assistance; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 71 percent of West Virginians currently or previously have provided care for a family member or friend which equates to an estimated 290 million hours a year and an estimated value of \$2.8 million each year; and

WHEREAS, to successfully address the surging population of older adults who have significant needs for long-term services and supports, the county may consider developing methods to both encourage and support families to support their aging relatives and develop ways to recruit and retain a qualified, responsive in-home care workforce;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Lewis County Commission


- (1) Supports the dedicated work of family caregivers in Lewis County and will continue to seek additional ways to support these individuals through information, education, training and relief care;

- (3) Strongly encourages additional innovative and creative means to support family caregivers to continue to provide needed in-home support for older adults.






