Proposed Scope of Services: The purpose of our geotechnical engineering services is to perform an additional subsurface investigation at the site to develop opinions on the soil, and groundwater conditions, and present conclusions and recommendations for site earthwork based on the Market Study conceptual drawing developed by CEC. CEC proposes the following scope of services to achieve the above-stated purpose:

<u>Engineering and Research</u>: CEC will plan, coordinate, and execute the office and fieldwork required to perform the subsurface investigations. A site-specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP) will be generated for the safety of CEC representatives and subcontractors working at the site.

<u>Locate Test Borings and Site Reconnaissance</u>: CEC field located the test borings with a handheld global positioning system (GPS) during the client meeting held onsite May 14, 2024. Additional borings suggested by the client will be staked the day of the drilling operations. These include test borings B-12, B-21, B-22, B-23, B-24, and B-25. A dozer is proposed for access to the majority of the test boring locations.

Test Drilling: CEC will subcontract with a local drilling contractor to perform an additional seventeen (17) test borings. The test borings are proposed at the project site with depths up to 120 feet below the existing ground surface. CEC is unable to drill a test boring downslope of Test Boring B-8 to evaluate the mine spoil fill bench due to access restriction based on discussions with the client. The drilling contractor will drill the test borings to planned depths or split-spoon refusal on bedrock. Depth to bedrock could exceed 40 feet in areas of mine spoil. Soils will be sampled with a split-spoon sampler using the Standard Penetration Test (SPT) in accordance with ASTM D1586. Rock coring will be performed at selected boring locations after refusal. The following test boring schedule presents the boring program discussed with the commission during the May 14th onsite meeting.

Monitor Drilling and Log Samples: CEC will provide a qualified representative to monitor the test drilling, observe the materials encountered, prepare field logs, and make modifications to the drilling program, if necessary. CEC's representative will obtain water levels during soil sampling, after soil sampling, and after 24 hours when possible. Computer-generated field logs of the test borings will be included in our report.

<u>Laboratory Testing:</u> CEC will perform geotechnical laboratory testing on select samples obtained during the test drilling. Laboratory testing will likely include Atterberg Limits (plasticity), grain size analysis, moisture content, total sulfur, paste Ph, chloride, and sulfate testing. CEC will obtain bulk samples from proposed cut elevations for standard Proctor and direct shear testing.

<u>Analysis</u>: CEC will review the results of the test drilling and laboratory testing and perform geotechnical analyses to develop conclusions on the site subsurface soil and groundwater conditions. CEC will also develop site preparation, earthwork, and geotechnical construction recommendations. It should be noted that CEC cannot provide stability analyses on existing mine spoil fill that extends onto adjacent properties where subsurface investigations cannot currently be performed.

<u>Report</u>: CEC will prepare a geotechnical letter report describing the subsurface conditions encountered and presenting the conclusions and recommendations in accordance with the purpose. The report will include test-boring logs, a test boring location plan, and the results of the laboratory testing.

Estimated Fees And Terms: The estimated fees are summarized below. These fees are based on our current understanding of the anticipated work effort. Please note that the scope and budget may require adjustment as the design progresses. The Schedule of Terms and Conditions provided in our original geotechnical proposal, dated December 14, 2023, are applicable to this change order.

<u>Drilling</u>: This drilling estimate is based on the drilling of 445 linear feet of soil, 195 feet of rock coring, and the following assumptions:

- 1. County Commission of Lewis County will provide contact information and right-of-entry through private property for the field operations;
- 2. The test drilling can be completed in eight (8) to nine (9) days;
- 3. The test borings will be backfilled with soil cuttings;
- 4. Excavations required for drill rig access to test borings will be seeded and mulched:
- 5. A track-mounted drill rig will be used, and

CEC will notify County Commission of Lewis County immediately in the event subsurface conditions require additional scope/costs. Additional scope items will only proceed with authorization from County Commission of Lewis County.


